



Sailing the St. Lawrence Seaway Featuring Quebec City and Montreal Aug 11-19, 2026

Set sail along the St. Lawrence Seaway, the rivers, locks, canals and channels in Eastern Canada that links together the Atlantic Ocean and the Great Lakes. Plus, visit Quebec City and Montreal!

Tuesday, Aug 11, 2026: Quebec City

Meet Dea and Declan at the St. Louis Airport late morning as we fly Air Canada non-stop to **Montreal**. We then board a motorcoach for Quebec City. We will stop for a bite to eat and have a late check-in to our hotel: Hotel Chateau Laurier

Wednesday, Aug 12, 2026: Quebec City and Setting Sail!

After our full hot breakfast, we head out to explore this amazing city, one of the oldest European settlements in North America and the last city with fortified walls North of Mexico. Founded by the French in 1541, they named the region after the Iroquois word for settlement, *Kanata*, which would later be the basis for the name "Canada." This afternoon we arrive at the **M/V Canadian Empress** to begin our **St. Lawrence River Cruise**. For the next 7 days we will be sailing back along the river, seeing French Canada in a whole different way! The Canadian Empress looks like a charming steamboat from the outside, but the inside is much more comfortable, with modern technology for both comfort and safety.

Enjoy delicious regional cuisine starting whilst onboard, with complimentary domestic beer or ship's private reserve wine with meals. Tonight, we cruise along the waterfront, seeing the twinkling lights of Quebec City reflecting upon the water. **(B, D)**

Thursday, Aug 13, 2026: Sailing towards Trois Rivières

This morning after breakfast, we enjoy a sail up the river towards Trois Rivières. Located in the Mauricie region of Quebec, Trois Rivières takes its name from the three channels in the Saint-Maurice River as it flows into the Saint Lawrence Rivers. It is the second oldest French settlement in what was then called New France, dating back to 1634. It is the oldest industrial city in Canada, with a foundry built in the 1730s. We will learn about this and more at the **Borealis Industrial Museum**, where we have a guided tour this afternoon. This evening, we enjoy the evening with entertainment after dinner. **(B, L, D)**

Friday, Aug 14, 2026: Sailing to Montreal!

Enjoy a day of sailing along the river as we sail back to Montreal. We arrive this afternoon at the Old Port of Montreal, where we take a short walk to the **Montreal Museum of History and Archaeology**. During our guided tour we will learn about the various people who have called this area home over the years, from the First Nation Peoples to more modern waves of immigration. We then return to the boat for another wonderful evening. **(B,L,D)**



Saturday, Aug 15, 2026: Traversing the Locks on the way to Cornwall

We sail today towards Cornwall, passing through a number of locks along the seaway, including the St. Lambert and Ste. Catherine Locks to enter the St. Lawrence Seaway system as well as the upper and lower Beauharnois Locks as we sail the day away. Enjoy plenty of shipboard activities along the way, or just enjoy the scenery as we cruise on by.



Sunday, Aug 16, 2026: A Big Dam Tour

After breakfast this morning, we tour the Moses-Saunders Power Dam, a massive dam that supplies power to both the US and Canada as well as helping larger ships to navigate the complex part of the river and the level of Lake Ontario. We then return to the ship, sailing through Eisenhower & Snell Locks on our way into Lake St. Lawrence, followed by the lock at the Seaway Control Dam Iroquois. Eventually this evening we arrive at Brockville, the city of the 1000 islands. Take a stroll after dinner or hang out in the lounge for the fun entertainment. **(B,L,D)**



Monday, Aug 17, 2026: Fulford Mansion and Millionaire's Row

After breakfast we depart by bus for a guided tour of **Fulford Place**, Once the home of Canadian Senator George Taylor Fulford, it is now a National Historic Site of Canada, full of Edwardian antiques. Spanning over 20,000 sq feet and with 35 rooms, it is a gem of

Beaux-Arts architecture. From the grand entrance hall to a dining room with seating for more than 30, the house was designed for entertaining. The gardens are of the Italianate style and laid out by the renowned **Olmsted Brothers**. Sadly, over time the estate shrunk, as parcels were sold off by George Taylor Fulford II to maintain the home. Upon his death, the Ontario Heritage Foundation took over the home, and the original furniture and fixtures were subsequently donated by his widow and son. The Fulford house is



just one of the many mansions along the river, which the locals call Millionaires Row. We will enjoy an extended cruise to see these homes this afternoon before sailing to. Enjoy an extended cruise to see these homes before we make our way to **Gananoque**, an island community which played an important role in the War of 1812. **(B,L,D)**

Tuesday, Aug 18, 2026: Breakfast Cruise through the 1000 Islands

Enjoy breakfast while cruising through the 1000 Islands before we tour the **1000 Islands Boat Museum**. Learn about the nautical history of the area and how it influenced not only life in the region but also its impact on the history of North America. We then return to the ship as we sail through the Canadian Channel and arrive in Kingston, where, after lunch and a harbor tour, we disembark in **Kingston**. Enjoy a city tour this afternoon before arriving to our hotel for the evening: Holiday Inn Waterfront **(B,L)**

Wednesday, Aug 19, 2026: and Home! Enjoy breakfast this morning before heading to the Toronto airport for our early afternoon non-stop flight home aboard Air Canada. **(B)**

Airfare is based on current tax rate/fuel surcharges. A supplement may be assessed if they increase before final payment or if you book after the deadline. Call us if you want to fly from another location! - You may ALWAYS book your air, just arrive before the group. Ask for adjustment in pricing.

A **deposit of \$3,000** per person is due when signing up for this tour. Final Payment is due March 15, 2026. The 4% discount is for checks and payment apps like Cash App, Zelle or PayPal, while you get a 1.8% discount with a bank ACH. Multiple payments and types of payment are accepted towards the tour, but there will not be any discount on portions paid by credit card.

This has been a highly requested tour, and we only have a limited number of cabins available. If you want to go, please call our office and you can also email you want to go. We will allow 7 days for your check to arrive, or you can pay with credit card at the first listed above rate.

We are working in a new system called Group Collect. You may pay online with credit card too but receive no discount. If you enter your own bank account info and pay it then receive a 1.8% discount off the initial price shown above.

We encourage trip interruption and cancellation insurance. You will want to send that with your deposit so as to cover pre-existing conditions. We are also offering coverage through TripMate in conjunction with Group Collect and can begin offering it on tours not previously booked. The pricing on group insurance is NOT based on age, just the price of the tour. Ask us for details.

The individual trip insurance policy is based on both age and price of tour. We can check for best fit. We also offer Cancel Any Time policies but they are often much more expensive and you receive either 75% or 80% of the full tour price you paid, based on which insurance company, of what you paid for the tour if reason is not a covered reason. You MUST purchase 14 days after deposit. If it is covered, you will receive the full amount once the claim information has been filed and approved by the insurance company.
